ORGANIZING AUTHORITY

This event will be organized by Hayling Island Sailing Club in conjunction with RS Sailing.

1 RULES

1.1 The event will be governed by the *rules* as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.



- 1.2 The penalty system to be used for each class will be set out in the Sailing Instructions. The Sailing Instructions will be available from 12th May 2024.
- 1.3 For all classes except the RS200. RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.
- 1.4 Competitors should note that Hayling Island SC implements the RYA Racing Charter and that they will be expected to sail in compliance with it. The Charter can be found at: www.rya.org.uk/racing/rules/racing-charter

2 COMMUNICATIONS & SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.1 All documents governing this event, including the sailing instructions, will be available from the event website and official notice board hosted by Hayling Island Sailing Club via this link: XXXX
- 2.2 Links to the documents and other information, including online entry forms, will be provided from the RS Event website: www.rssailing.com/rs30th
- 2.3 [DP] Whilst racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

3 ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY

- 3.1 The event is open to boats of the RS100, RS200, RS300 RS400, RS500, RS600, RS700, RS800 classes, RS21, RS Elite, RS Aero, RS Tera, RS Feva and RS Vareo classes. Please note that this event forms part of the 2024 Rooster National or Championship Tour for various classes as stated above.
- 3.2 The Masters entry for the RS200 and RS Vareo classes is restricted to helms aged 45 or older at the start of the event. The Masters entry for the RS400, RS500, RS600, RS700, RS800 classes is restricted to helms aged 50 or older at the start of the event.
- 3.3 The helm shall be a member of the UK or International RS Class Association. UK crews shall be a member of the RS Class Association, except where the helm has a valid 'any crew extension' to their membership.
- 3.4 Eligible boats may enter by completing the online entry form on the RS Sailing Club Portal. Follow the 'Enter Online' tab on the RS Event website: www.rssailing.com/rs30th
- 3.5 To be considered an entry at an event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.
- 3.6 Competitors under 18 years of age shall submit signed Parent/Guardian Declarations before racing. Forms can be downloaded from the HISC Official Noticeboard and either submitted in advance to: sailing.coordinator@hisc.co.uk or in person at registration.

- 6.3 The first warning signal on both Friday 17th and Saturday 18th May is scheduled for 12.00. A maximum of 4 races for each class can be sailed each day. The Organising Authority reserve the right to get up to one race ahead of schedule.
- 6.4 On the last day of the regatta no warning signal will be made after 15:00.

7 EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

Boats may be inspected at any time for compliance with class rules.

8 VENUE

- 8.1 The racing areas will include Bracklesham Bay, Hayling Bay and Chichester Harbour.
- 8.2 Venue information is available at www.hisc.co.uk

9 COURSES

The courses to be sailed will be a combination of windward/leeward and trapezoid courses and will vary for each class.

10 SCORING

- 10.1 Two races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 10.2 a) When fewer than four races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
 - b) When from four to seven races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
 - c) When eight or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.

11 SUPPPORT PERSON VESSELS

- 11.1 All support/coach boats shall register at the HISC office.
- 11.2 All support/coach boats shall: have a vhf on board; always use a kill cord when the engine is running and wear life jackets whilst afloat.

12 BERTHING

[DP] Boats shall be kept in their assigned places whilst ashore in the boat park.

13 MEDIA RIGHTS

By entering the event, competitors automatically grant to the organizing authority without payment the right in perpetuity to make, use and show any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped, or filmed television of or relating to the event.

14 DATA PROTECTION

The RS Sailing Data Protection Policy is available on the RS Sailing website.

15 RISK STATEMENT

- 15.1 RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.'
- 15.2 Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:



- (a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event.
- (b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat, and their other property whether afloat or ashore.
- (c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions.
- (d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate.
- (e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organizer does not relieve them of their own responsibilities.
- (f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions as can be practically provided in the circumstances.
- (g) It is their responsibility to familiarize themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules or information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event.

16 INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £3 million per incident or the equivalent.

17 PRIZES

17.1 Prizes may be awarded, dependent on entry numbers and at the discretion of the Organizing Authority. Prizes will be awarded to at least the top three in each class, plus Master and Corinthian categories as specified in each's classes definitions.
